State Rep Updates

Florida – The State of Florida is in the final stage of preparing our new Stormwater Erosion and Sedimentation Inspector’s Control Manual. In June we will hold a webinar with all our instructors to break them in to the many changes to our State’s manual. In July we go to teaching our new materials including all new PowerPoints, plus an automated grading and certificate process. So, we are excited to get this rolling soon!

Georgia - Victoria – New permit will be active this year.

Tennessee- Chris Todd – Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam announced April 6 that Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation Commissioner Bob Martineau is leaving at the end of April. He has headed the department since 2011 and will work in the private sector with a nonprofit group. Deputy Commissioner Shari Meghreblian has been named as the Governor’s choice to succeed Martineau. Dr. Meghreblian is a wise choice for the position, bringing years of experience in the private sector as well as the public service arena for a unique blend of understanding, mediation, and customer appreciation. She will take the reins on May 1.
